
Parking Instructions

Asburyans and guests, on church business, should park in the parking garage and bring the printed parking ticket with them to be validated in the church office. Park on levels P2 or P3 and take the elevator to the "G" level to exit the building (to the left toward 11th Street). Drivers will scan the front of the ticket (invoice) and then scan the back (the payment). Push the call button if you have any issues and the Atlantic Garage Staff will assist you.

Saturday & Sunday

Parking is available on Saturday and Sunday until 4 pm (unless otherwise noted). Park on levels P2 or P3 and take the elevator to the "G" level to exit the building (to the left toward 11th Street). The church provides parking passes (half sheet paper passes) to use as you exit the garage.

Dr. Mills Serves as a Clergy Delegate



Asbury United Methodist Church sponsors the Asbury Higher Education and Campus Ministry (HECM) Scholarship Program.

Each scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship that is awarded to graduating high school seniors and current undergraduate students. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities.

To be a candidate for a scholarship, applicant must be (1) affiliated with Asbury; (2) be in good academic standing (as defined by minimum academic requirements); (3) include your college transcript from your most recent college year.

FULLY FUNDING the -**ACCESS TO JUSTICE PROGRAM**

Unlike in the criminal system, the civil legal system has no guarantee of an attorney for people who cannot afford one. This means that low-income DC residents facing eviction, child custody issues, and even severe immigration consequences such as deportation, must rely on funds from DC's Access to Justice funding to secure a lawyer to protect their basic human rights and dignity.





The Mayor's proposed budget for FY 25 cuts these vital funds for low-income and vulnerable DC residents by 67%!

These drastic and unnecessary cuts will make our communities less safe and increase already unconscionable racial disparities in wealth and housing security in our city.

DC's Access to Justice fund served over **40,000** residents in 2023

76% of people represented by Access to Justice

Funded legal representation were able to stay in their homes and avoid unjust evictions by profit driven landlords and property management companies.

Provided free legal interpretative services to over

7500 people in civil court proceedings and turned down more clients due to funding constraints.



Access to Justice partners and grantees saved DC residents a total of 4 million

in unauthorized Medicaid payment costs.

The Initiative provided funds for free Domestic Violence & immigration workshops

for impacted, low income, vulnerable residents, especially those with dependent children.

People caught up in the civil legal system can face devastating consequences for not having legal representation, including losing their home, their children, their life savings or their ability to remain in the country with their families. Providing legal representation to those in the civil system keeps our communities safer and stronger and ensures that the wealthy do not exploit the poor and vulnerable.

WHAT THE SCRIPTURES SAY

One of the major themes running throughout Scripture is the importance of ensuring all people, no matter their economic, social, or political status have access to justice and the courts.

Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every people anyone who fears God and practices righteousness is acceptable."

ACTS 10:34-35

When a stranger sojourns with you in your land, you shall not do them wrong. You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love them as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt. I am the Lord your God.

LEVITICUS 19:33-34

You shall appoint judges and officials throughout your tribes, in all your towns that the Lord your God is giving you, and they shall render just decisions for the people. You must not distort justice; you must not show partiality; and you must not accept a bribe, for a bribe blinds the eyes of the wise and subverts the cause of those who are in the right. Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue.

Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove your evil deeds from before my eyes; cease to do evil; learn to do good; seek justice; rescue the oppressed; defend the orphan; plead for the widow.
