THE GREAT THANKSGIVING FOR EASTER SEASON



Asbury United Methodist Church Health Ministry Newsletter May 2024 May is Mental Health Month By: Dr. Clive O. Callender

Good health does not exist without good mental health. Mental health is a universal concern and everyone deserves access to mental health services. It is absolutely necessary to raise awareness, reduce stigma and improve access to mental health services for all Americans, and especially African Americans!

Approximately 21 percent of African Americans have been diagnosed with a mental illness according to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. African Americans are more likely than Whites to have post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and schizophrenia. Unfortunately, only one third of African Americans who need mental health care actually receive it. While 40% of Whites seek mental health treatment, only 25% of African Americans do the same.

African Americans experience feelings of sadness, hopelessness, and worthlessness at higher rates than Whites. For African Americans ages 15 to 24, suicide was the third leading cause of death.

The most significant barriers to African-American mental health care today are:


- 1. Mental health treatment can be expensive. Many mental health professionals will not accept health insurance as payment for services and many health insurance plans do not cover mental health services.
- 2. Stigma and shame may keep many from admitting to mental health concerns and seeking help. African-American families are more likely to be dismissive of mental health issues. think that going to a therapist is a sign of weakness and source of shame.
- 3. Lack of diversity among mental health practitioners means many African Americans may have difficulty finding someone they connect with for treatment. According to 2019 data from the American Psychological Association (APA), about 83% of the U.S. psychology workforce is white. According to the same report, African Americans represent just 3 percent of psychologists. African Americans make up about 13 percent of the American population.
- 4. Poor cultural competency among non-black mental health clinicians often leads to poorer care and misdiagnoses for African Americans.
- 5. "Whiteness" as a foundation of mental health care means white folks' norms and cultures are the basis for comparisons. These norms may not apply to African Americans.
- 6. A basic distrust of the medical industry. Black people have historically been negatively affected by prejudice and discrimination in the health care system in the US.
- 7. Difficulty navigating the health care system.

- 8. Culturally, many African Americans are taught to keep their feelings to themselves and are reluctant to share their emotions with others.
- 9. Negative past experiences with mental health professionals often due to provider bias (conscious or unconscious) and lack of cultural competency.
- 10. Blacks are more likely to be subject to involuntary treatment, whether it is forced inpatient or outpatient treatment.


