The Great Thanksgiving For Lent

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty (almighty God), creator of heaven and earth. You brought all things into being and called them good. From the dust of the earth you formed us into your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. When rain fell upon the earth for forty days and forty nights, you bore up the ark on the waters, saved Noah and his family, and made covenant with every living creature on earth. When you led your people to Mount Sinai for forty days and forty nights, you gave us your commandments and made us your covenant people. When your people forsook your covenant, your prophet Elijah fasted for forty days and forty nights; and on your holy mountain, he heard your still small voice. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the
highest.**

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. When you gave him to save us from our sin, your Spirit led him into the wilderness, where he fasted forty days and forty nights to prepare for his ministry. When he suffered and died on a cross for our sin, you raised him to life, presented him alive to the apostles during forty days, and exalted him at your right hand. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

Now, when we your people prepare for the yearly feast of Easter, you lead us to repentance for sin and the cleansing of our hearts, that during these forty days of Lent we may be gifted and graced to reaffirm the covenant you made with us through Christ.

The Great Thanksgiving For Lent

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, Jesus took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to the disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving, as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father (God), now and forever.

Word for the Month: The Gift of Lent



Grace and peace to you!

Can we talk about 40 days and 40 nights?

While that language is directly connected to Jesus's wilderness experience in the Gospel of Matthew 4:1-2, it also becomes the model upon which the season of Lent is built. Lent operates like a wilderness. It is a sacred interruption, a time meant to help us shed the external, unnecessary, and trivial distractions that keep us distant from ourselves and, sometimes, distant from God.

It is a season set aside to quiet the noise of life so we can hear again the whisper of God. Not the thunder. Not the earthquake. But the **whisper**.

The thing I love most about the framing of forty days and forty nights is something I learned from all my traveling. If you stay in a hotel and ask for forty days and forty nights, you are actually paying for forty-one days. They charge you for that last night. That final night completes the circle. You don't leave at midnight. You leave in the morning. You leave when the night has done its work.

And so, whatever you carry with you into this Lenten season, know that when the season is over, when it has ended, when **we learn to leave "it" there**, it will literally be a brand-new day.

Monday - Friday






March 20 – 22, 2026 -- Ignite Youth Retreat





Some Habits to Try Every Day for a Healthier Year

1. Brush your teeth with a fluoride toothpaste for two minutes twice each day. It is also a good idea to brush after eating or drinking to remove the food particles that get trapped between the teeth and along the gumline.
2. Clean your ears the right way. Wipe around the outer ear with a damp washcloth or a Q-tip. Do not put anything inside the ear canal.
3. Be strategic when applying deodorant and anti-perspirant. Deodorant, which masks odors, can be applied anytime throughout the day. Antiperspirants, which help prevent sweat and associated odors, work best when applied to clean, dry skin at bedtime.
4. Make your bed at least every other day. Those who do are more likely to get quality sleep at night.
5. Wear socks to bed at night. This allows the body's core temperature to drop and signals the body to get ready for sleep.
6. Aim for seven to eight hours of sleep every night. Adequate rest is essential for proper brain function and memory.
7. Minimize the effects of chronic stress by meditating for 30 minutes a day, five days a week.
8. Maintain an active social life and interact with friends as often as possible.
9. Get at least 30 minutes of aerobic exercise, five days a week, and include weight resistance exercise at least three days a week.
10. Challenge your brain by learning something new. Consider taking a class, learning to play an instrument, or adopting a new hobby.
11. Follow a diet full of fruits, vegetables, nuts and seeds and avoid highly processed foods.
